Sorting/setting out recyclables and garbage

This time we look at [burnable garbage and non-burnable] garbage

Burnable garbage

▼Includes:

Food scraps, wood chips, shells, cloth items, stuffed animals, paper diapers, yard clippings, weeds, unrecyclable paper scraps (paper cups, tissue paper, photos, etc.)

▼Disposal:

①Remove excess water from food scraps

- 2 Put burnable garbage into an official burnable garbage bag (white) (other bags or cardboard boxes not allowed)
- ③ Take the garbage to the burnable garbage collection site

Non-burnable garbage

▼Includes:

Ceramics, glass, leather, plastics (other than containers and packaging), rubber, light bulbs, batteries, lighters, etc.

📥 Cautio

Many metal objects and recyclable plastics have been found mixed with non-burnable garbage. Make sure to check whether items are recyclable before throwing them out as garbage.

Caution Please remove gas from lighters to

avoid causing fires.

Place your bagged

recyclables and garbage out at the collection point by 8:30

on the designated collection day

①Put non-burnable garbage into an official bag

- $\textcircled{2}\ensuremath{\mathsf{Take}}$ the garbage to the recyclable collection site
 - Wrap dangerous items such as broke glass in waste paper or other material and clearly mark them.Please return used button batteries, nickel-cadmium batteries, and the like to the place of purchase.

Q: How should I dispose of items like lighters?

Empty them completely of their contents and dispose of with non-burnable garbage (red bags). *Disposing of lighters without completely using the content may result in fires in the garbage truck.

Q: How should I dispose of kerosene tanks?

Empty them completely of their contents and dispose of with non-burnable garbage (red bags).

※Items larger than 60 cm are bulk garbage.

Changes coming to the Immigration Control Act and Basic Resident Register Law!

Certificates of Residence (Juminhyo) will be issued for foreign residents

As the number of foreigners immigrating and residing in Japan increases each year, the municipalities face the growing need for a system to provide the same basic governmental services to foreign nationals that are provided to Japanese citizens. To address this need foreign residents will be covered by the same basic resident registry as Japanese to rationalize municipal government services and promote increased convenience for foreign residents. This change was publicized on July 15, 2009 with the approval of the Law to Revise Part of the Residential Basic Book Act by the 171th National Diet of Japan. The effective date of the act is the same as the date of execution for the amended Immigration Control Act (scheduled for around July 2012).

Description of the revisions ("What will change?")

- 1. The Alien Registration system will be abolished and foreign residents will be covered by the Residential Basic Book Act.
 - Households will have a single Certificate of Residence (Juminhyo) for Japanese and foreigners.
 It will be possible to issue a copy of the Certificate of Residence with all members of the household for mixed households.
 - When moving out of the current City Hall, foreigners will now be required to submit a notification at the City Hall where you live and then submit it to the destination City Hall.
- 2. Residence Cards (Zairyu Card) or Special Permanent Residence Certificates (Tokubetsu Eijusha Shomeisho) will be issued in place of Certificates of Alien Registration (Gaikokujin Toroku Shomeisho)
 - Notifications to the City Hall will take place when a new address has been set or when the address changes.
 Notification to the City Hall will no longer be required with applications for status of residence, changes thereto, or changes to passports, etc.

Applications for issuance of Special Permanent Residence Certificates (Tokubetsu Eijusha homeisho) will be to the City Hall.
 These legal amendments are thought to improve convenience for foreign residents and result in less administrative expense.

Foreign residents who a Certificate of Residence will be issued:

Foreign nationals that have a permanent residence and that stay legally more than 3 months, excluding persons temporarily in Japan.

(1) Medium and long-term residents (subject to issuance of Residence Card)

- (2) Special permanent residents
- (3) Holders of a permit for temporary refugee or provisional residence permit
- (4) Persons with extended stays due to birth or loss of nationality
- *Certificates of Residence may not be issued for people without status of residence on the date of execution of the revised law (including people that have not notified Komaki City of updates to the alien registry during their period of residence), and people not in the above list as they are not subject to creation thereof. If necessary, please perform the necessary procedures as soon as possible.
- *Before execution of the amendment (between March and June 2012) a provisional Juminhyo will be sent by postal mail to the address of residence (the address in the foreign registrar). Please apply at City Hall if you notice any mistakes.
- * Please see the websites of the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications and the Ministry of Justice for more details regarding the legal revision.

Disaster Prevention Topics 5 When you feel an earthquake / What to do about earthquake early warnings

Earthquake early warnings are warnings and information during shaking for notification in advance of strong tremors (at least a 4 on the JMA seismic intensity scale). Komaki City has devices installed in elementary and junior high schools, City Hall and other public facilities. Take care with any of the following actions when you feel the shaking or the early warning is sent out.

Submit your payments promptly!Smooth functioning of the system requires that everyone make timely payments. Avoid missed payments by setting up direct debit payments from your bank account.

If you have already set up direct debit payments for your taxes, be sure that your account has sufficient funds available by the day before payment is due.

If your payment is late the City Hall will send you an invoice (reminder) again to notify you of overdue payment. City employees may also visit your home. Please pay early when you remember. You may have a sound reason for your delayed payment, but the City Hall Tax Office will not know this if you do not consult with or contact us. Please notify us of any special circumstances as soon as possible. If it is determined that lack of payment or consultation was intentional it may be determined to be malicious resulting in collection procedures (seizures, etc.).

If you are too busy during the day on weekdays to make your payment...
1. The City Hall Income Tax Office will be open on the following Sundays to answer tax-related questions and accept payments.
Date/Time: Oct 9 (Sun) & Oct 23 (Sun) 8:30-17:15
2. Tax payments will be accepted at the Komaki Station branch office every day. Please stop by at your convenience.
Reception hours: 8:30–17:15 **The Komaki Station branch office is closed during the New Year holidays.
3. If your payment slip has a barcode, you may pay your taxes at a local convenience store. **Convenience store payments can only be made prior to the payment due date.
