Sorting/setting out recyclables and garbage

Komaki has specific rules for separating recyclables and garbage. Keep the following points in mind when setting out your recyclables and garbage:

Please make sure that you are sorting your recyclables and garbage properly.

1 Dispose of recyclables and garbage in designated Komaki City garbage bags. (※Always separate by items.)



※Komaki City garbage bags can be purchased at supermarkets, convenience stores, and drug stores.

Use white bags for burnable garbage.



Use red bags for non-burnable garbage.

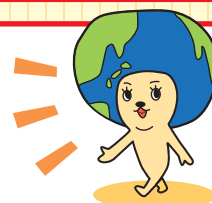


Use green bags for recyclables.



2 Follow pamphlet guidelines for separating and setting out your recyclables and garbage.

- Pamphlets are available in Portuguese, Spanish, English, Chinese, and Tagalog. They can be obtained at City Hall or one of the Civic Centers. They can also be accessed from the Komaki City website.



3 Check the collection calendar and place your bagged recyclables and garbage out at the collection point by 8:30 a.m. on the designated collection day.

Residential taxes changing in 2013

- An **exemption for nursing care** insurance has been added to the existing exemptions for life insurance premiums and personal pension payments.
- The limit for amounts where an exemption applies to life insurance contracts entered after Jan 1, 2012 is **28,000 yen** each for life insurance premiums, personal pension payments and nursing care insurance.
- If the total of the following three exemptions exceeds 70,000 yen, the limit is **70,000 yen** as before.

1. Insurance premiums for contracts entered after Jan 1, 2012 (new contracts)

Calculating exemptions for life insurance premiums, personal pension payments and nursing care insurance.

Table 1	Insurance premiums paid during the year	Health insurance premium exemptions
	12,000 yen and under	Total paid insurance premiums
	More than 12,000 yen and up to 32,000 yen	Paid insurance premiums x 1/2 + 6,000 yen
	More than 32,000 yen and up to 56,000 yen	Paid insurance premiums x 1/4 + 14,000 yen
	More than 56,000 yen	28,000 yen

2. Insurance premiums for contracts entered before Dec 31, 2011 (old contracts)

Calculating exemptions for life insurance premiums and personal pension payments.

Table 2	Insurance premiums paid during the year	Health insurance premium exemptions
	15,000 yen and under	Total paid health insurance premiums
	More than 15,000 yen and up to 40,000 yen	Paid insurance premiums x 1/2 + 7,500 yen
	More than 40,000 yen and up to 70,000 yen	Paid insurance premiums x 1/4 + 17,500 yen
	More than 70,000 yen	35,000 yen

3. When insurance exemptions are present for both new and old contracts

The exemption is the total of the following A and B. (Applicable limit amount of 28,000 yen)

- A. The premiums paid for new contracts use the calculation from Table 1 on the left
- B. The premiums paid for old contracts use the calculation from Table 2 on the left





① The method for calculating residence taxes paid on retirement income will change from Jan 1, 2013.

- The 10% exemption for residence taxes from retirement allowances, etc., will be eliminated.
- After exempting the exemption amount for retirement income from retirement allowances, etc., paid to corporate executives within 5 years of their continuous employment, halving the remainder is being eliminated.

※“Corporate executives” refers to presidents of organizations, regional councilmembers and national or local civil servants.

Avoid missed payments by setting up direct debit payments from your bank account. If you have already set up direct debit payments for your taxes, be sure that your account has sufficient funds available by the day before payment is due.

Support for school entrance fees for advanced education

✳ Komaki offers support for portions of admissions fees for high schools and other educational institutions.



Eligibility

Students graduating from a Komaki junior high school seeking admission at a high school or occupational educational institute (3 year or more program) that also is both:

- (a) Highly motivated with better than average grades; and,
- (b) Not financially well off.

Amount of support

100,000 yen per person (up to 30 persons; applicants will be screened)

Application

Submit the required documents to the attended junior high school by Jan 11 (Fri).

- ① **Application for Komaki Scholarship Grant** (Available at the schools and school education division at City Hall)
- ② Persons that moved to Komaki after Jan 2, 2012 must submit one of the following documents
 - Municipal/Prefectural Tax Special Collection Tax Payment Notice (copy)
 - Municipal/Prefectural Tax Payment Slip and Tax Receipt (copy)
 - Municipal/Prefectural Tax (Income/Taxation) Certificate (issued at previous place of residence)
