Ride the Komakuru to get out and about!



Komakuru is a green bus with routes throughout the City.
You can catch the Komakuru at green bus stops.
Komakuru is also accessible for those with wheelchairs or baby strollers.

Fees

Adult 200 yen, Elementary students 100 yen,
Seniors over 65 and infants ride free for all day.

How to ride

When it is almost time for the bus to arrive, wait in front of the bus stop.



When the bus arrives, confirm where it is going.
* If you need assistance, such as with a wheelchair, tell the person driving.



Pay the fare at the box at the start of your ride.
* Receive the Komakuru ticket from the driver.
When riding again on the same day, show the driver your Komakuru ticket.
* There are no money changers (machines that give change) on the buses.
Credit cards (only touch payment is accepted), transportation IC cards, electronic money, and code payment (PayPay) are also accepted.



Get on the bus from the door at the front.



Sit in an open seat.



When the name of the stop you wish to get off at is announced, press the button.



Don't worry.
There are many buttons for getting off.



Get off the bus. If the bus has two doors, get off the bus at the back. If the bus has only one door, get off at the front.

Subsidy for Household Global Warming Prevention Measure Equipment Installation Costs

The installation expenses for Komaki City residents who installed Household Global Warming Prevention Measure Equipment to their houses will be subsidized.

Eligibility

Those who install equipment to their houses or build a new house for their own living (including house complexes combined with stores, etc.) in Komaki in FY2026



Eligible equipment and subsidies

① One-time Support

- ▶ Home Fuel Cell System.....100,000 yen
- ▶ Home Energy Management System (HEMS).....10,000 yen
- ▶ Stationary Lithium Ion Battery System (rechargeable battery).....150,000 yen
- ▶ Power Charging Facility for Electric Vehicle, etc. (V2H).....50,000 yen

② Integrated Adoption Support

- a) Solar Power Generation/HEMS/Rechargeable Battery.....Max. 280,000 yen
- b) Solar Power Generation/HEMS/V2H.....Max. 180,000 yen
- c) Solar Power Generation System/HEMS/High Performance Cladding (Zero Energy House; ZEH).....Max. 230,000 yen
- d) Solar Power Generation System/HEMS/GX High Performance Cladding (GXZEH Standard).....Max. 530,000 yen

Application

Application must be complete before installation.

Light Vehicle Tax (All Terms)

Avoid missed payments by setting up direct debit payments from your bank account. If you have already set up direct debit payments for your taxes, be sure that your account has sufficient funds available by the day before payment is due. You can pay taxes using smartphone apps including PayB or PayPay.

Submit your payments promptly!

* Persons using direct deposit to account cannot use payment by app. Instructions are available on the website of the app.



When you are unable to pay by the predetermined date due to decreased wages or other reason, consult with the taxation division.

If the deadline passes, you will need to pay arrears (penalty for late payment).

If you are too busy during the day on weekdays to make your payment...

You can pay at a tax payment service counter open every Sunday.
(Except year end/ New Years)

① The main building's second floor will be open to answer tax-payment related questions. Payments are accepted as well.

Hours ▶ May 24 (Sun) 9:00 to 12:00

② The main building's first floor will be open to pay taxes.

Hours ▶ May 10 (Sun), 24 (Sun) 9:00 to 16:00

③ You can pay for payment notices with bar codes at convenience stores.

* Only effective during the period written on the payment slip.

*Certificates: Tax payment certificates are available at the Tax Collection Division (2F ⑥).

Income tax certificates are available at the Taxation Division (2F ④).

Make a Clean and Comfortable Neighborhood



The Local Neighborhood Association conducts activities to make a beautiful city such as cleaning the city including parks, etc., and management of the waste collection site to create a comfortable environment for the local residents.

Q What is a (ward) neighborhood association?

A A neighborhood association is an organization self-governed by local residents or companies.

There are 131 neighborhoods in the city and each neighborhood is working to improve their area through a variety of activities.

Q What are they doing?

A Neighborhood associations interact with the city government and work on many kinds of activities for the local residents.

The president of the neighborhood association, performs many different kinds of activities such as announcement of city information for the neighbors, asks City Hall for repairing roads and administration of garbage collection locations in coordination and contact with the city.

Issues or problems in the neighborhood cannot be solved alone. Join your local neighborhood association as a part of your local community and make your neighborhood better together.

Major activities of the neighborhood association.

Friendship promotion activities	Producing Bon dancing, festivals, sports festivals, senior recreation gatherings and so on.
Public relations activities	Distributing public relations of the city, and local information, and passing around notices.
Cleaning activities	Cleanup of parks, drainage gutters, and other community areas
Disaster prevention activities	Organizing fire/disaster prevention training, establishing local disaster prevention association.
Safety activities	Street activities on Zero Traffic Accident Death Day or crime prevention activities.
Garbage collection site management	Establishing and administration of garbage collection locations, etc.
Other	Performing many kinds of activities to expand the community such as managing a meeting place for local activities.

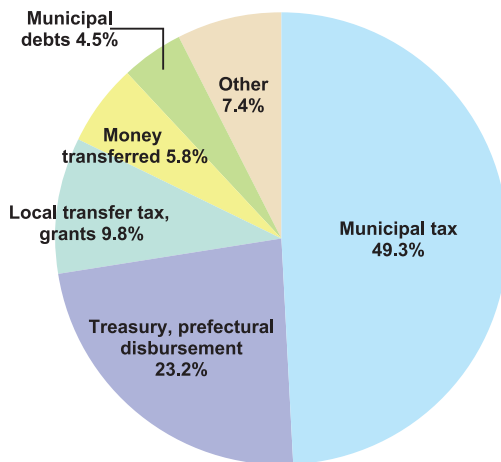

The general budget is the core budget, covering revenue and expenditures excluding special budgets.

The initial general budget for fiscal 2026 is 72,680,000,000 yen, which is about 2,324,000,000 yen more than the budget last term.

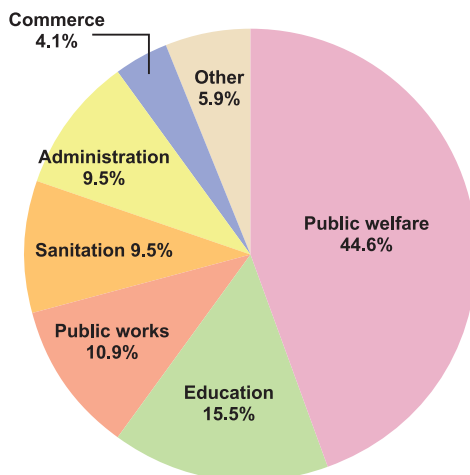


Revenue

Definitions

- **Municipal tax**.....Residential taxes on individual and companies, property taxes on land and buildings, etc.
- **Treasury, prefectural disbursement**.....Monies received from the country and prefecture
- **Local transfer tax, grants**.....Monies received from the country and prefecture
- **Money transferred**.....Monies received from municipal savings
- **Municipal debts**.....Monies borrowed from banks

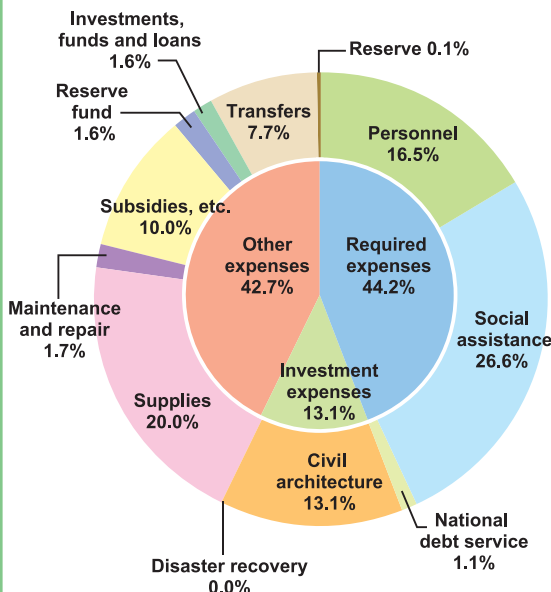


Expenditures (by purpose)

Definitions

- **Public welfare**.....Monies used for social projects
- **Education**.....Monies used for elementary and junior high education and cultural purposes
- **Public works**.....Monies used for road or river works
- **Sanitation**.....Monies used for preventing sickness and treating waste
- **Administration**.....Monies used for the municipal offices
- **Commerce**.....Monies used for the support for companies or for festivals



Expenditures (by category)

Total Expenditures (by category) 72,680,000,000 yen

Definitions

- **Personnel**.....Wages and allowances for employees
- **Social assistance**.....Monies for supporting people eligible for welfare or child assistance
- **Civil architecture**.....Monies for making roads, school, parks, etc.
- **Supplies**.....Monies required for operations
- **Required expenses**.....Obligations for the city including personnel, social assistance, and servicing public debt
- **Investment expenses**.....Monies spent on buildings, roads and other facilities that will remain beyond the current fiscal period

Routine vaccination against shingles



The period for vaccination for those eligible is April 1, 2026 to March 31, 2027.

- Vaccination tickets (postcards) will be sent to those who are eligible for the vaccination in late April. Please check the vaccination ticket for the medical institutions (hospitals and clinics) where vaccinations are available and the interval between vaccinations.
- Those who have received the shingles vaccine before are generally not eligible for routine vaccination.

Fee	① Dried attenuated attenuated live varicella vaccine (1 dose) ...2,400 yen/dose ② Dry recombinant shingles vaccine (2 doses) ...6,600 yen/dose] The person receiving the vaccination chooses one or the other.

The 2nd Series of Regular Vaccinations for Mumps/Rubella (MR)

The deadline for vaccination for those eligible in FY2026 is **March 31, 2027**.

Receive the vaccination earlier when you are feeling well (physically).

* Persons vaccinated at hospitals or clinics outside Komaki City should submit paperwork at the Health Center.



Fee Free **Eligibility** Born between April 2, 2020 and April 1, 2021

* Vaccination tickets are sent around the end of May.
